## When and How to Disclose Your Salary Requirements

The desired salary should always be about the job at hand, not what you were making before, what you hope to make,

In your answer, you  
can subtly emphasize

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like, “Based on my 10 years of experience in this field, I would expect a salary in the range of \$Y to \$Z. ” Before mentioning any numbers, remind the interviewer why he or she should offer you a salary in the first place.

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## About Your Salary Expectations

One way to include salary requirements in a cover letter is to list a salary range.

This gives you and the employer some flexibility. Make sure your salary range is realistic. Research what the position is worth by using salary surveys and salary



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calculators.
